材料

使德国陷入受奴役地位达一代之久,降低数百万生灵之生活水平以及剥夺其整个国 家、整个民族之幸福,是一项令人深恶痛绝的政策——即使这种政策事实上可行,即使 藉此能够养肥我们自己……如果法国和意大利准备利用它们暂时的战胜国权利去致掉 已经战败捉降的德国和奥匈帝国并以北来结束这场欧洲内战的话,它们自身同样会走向 毁灭,因为战胜闰和战败囚械背后的精神和经济纽带紧密地联系在了一起,密不可 分……通过把踪放支付额定在德国的支付能力之内,我们可以恢复德国的希望和进取 心,可以避免由和约条款不可能完成而导致的永久性摩擦以及不正常的压力……

- 答: 原因: 认定德国的战争责任; 汲取一战教训。反对民族利己主义和战胜国的掠夺; 将欧洲视为一个整体: 预见到和约的灾难性后果, 避免战争的重演。
